As is evident from the list above, we are in need of an additional member to join the Council and, ideally, we would really like to invite a resident from Cold Higham who would like to join the Council to make a positive change for the surrounding villages and help to address the daily issues faced by the Council.

We hold a meeting in the Cold Higham Village Hall every couple of months and the meeting would take just a couple of hours of your time. We are trying to resolve several long standing issues, such as the safety of our A5 junctions and if this matters to you, perhaps you are just the person we need to help us drive this forward?

The next Cold Higham Parish Council Meeting is on the 19<sup>th</sup> November at 19.30 at The Cold Higham Parish Hall. Please note that members of the public are welcome to attend these meetings.

As you will be aware from previous updates from the Cold Higham Parish Council, the A5 junction has been and still remains a major safety issue. We are still trying to resolve the issue of the visibility splay of Banbury Lane to the south. We have received broken promises and are frustrated by the lack of action by the responsible parties. Rest assured, we will continue to endeavour to get this resolved to our satisfaction and I look forward to bringing more positive news in the not too distant future.

It has also been brought to our attention that the church wall on Church Lane at Cold Higham has an issue with ivy and weeds. This problem has been duly noted and work is scheduled to address this.

Of further note, we were advised that the Cemetery needed to bring their burial fees into line with neighbouring Parishes and this has been actioned accordingly. We are hoping to have the revised fees outlined on the Parish website or in the meantime, please contact the Parish Clerk, Mrs. A. Addison via the website <u>coldhigham.org.uk</u>, for the revised figures.

# Pattishall Picnic in the Park Music Festival Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> July 2015

What a spectacular event this year! I didn't think we would be able to improve on last year's great day, but we did. Double the number of bands, singers, musicians, double the number of people who all came to listen, relax and enjoy themselves, which they did, and great weather!

After months of planning the music festival committee members and helpers started early on Friday morning with the heavy work of erecting 500 meters of perimeter fencing to keep everyone safe, setting up the stage and the site. Saturday morning started at 7.00 am setting up the sound system, erecting the gazebos, organising the gates, and a million other tasks all designed to make the day run smoothly.

There was a sense of eager anticipation and excitement in the air as just before midday people started queuing determined to get a good spot, and we swiftly opened the gates so they could do just that. By the wonder of advance payment through PayPal we were able to check people through quickly and attach their wristbands. People did several trips from their cars bringing gazebos, tables, chairs, cool boxes, in fact every portable convenience known to man! For the second year running I was amazed at what people bring with them for comfort in the outdoors!

The music was varied offering something for everyone, beginning with Towcester Rock School who kicked off the music at 1.00 pm, and several musicians and



singers from the school performed throughout the afternoon. Great to see these up and coming stars performing, for some of them the first time to such a large audience. Our headline act Ruse then rocked the crowd on the main stage at 1.30 pm and the music them flowed on, seamlessly, from one act to another all the way through till 11.00 pm when the Bicycle Thieves rounded off the evening with their rendition of Uptown Funk as their final number. Lots of people had migrated down the bank as dusk descended, and just like last year, had a good old bop around in the light drizzle, absorbing the music and atmosphere as they danced with each other. There were many great moments throughout the event, both musical and otherwise. For me one was having a caller with The Barn Rat Band, and watching young and old alike running forward to have a go at barn dancing, and really enjoying it. There was even a bit of line dance teaching going on to some country tracks performed by Roadhouse - the lead singer would have us believe she was



Dolly Parton's niece! Another special moment was seeing an older couple sitting in front of me reach out and hold hands during a powerful love song - it really tugged at my heart strings. And who could forget looking across at the play area and watching it transform into a sea of gold as bales of straw came apart and seeing children having a whale of a time throwing themselves around in it! Not such a whale of a time clearing it all up the next morning in the rain!!!

In total we featured 10 acts split across 2 stages, the exact line up can still be seen on our website, <u>www.picnicinthepark.org.uk</u>. We will soon start working on next year's festival so get the date in your diary now - **Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> July 2016**.

A huge thank you goes to all the many helpers and to the music festival committee; to Johnny Smith, who had the idea in the first place, oversees the whole event from start to finish and keeps us on the right track, to the new committee members this year, Ian Taylor, for your sound engineer expertise and more, Simon Parslow for the website and more, Paul Nichols for carpentry, practical ideas and more, Karen Stewart for treasurer skills and more. And to the second timers, Iris Illingworth, Josie Bateman, Jon Hibbert, Nigel Banister (great job organising all those musicians!) and me. I did have a break during the event to relax and enjoy the music, but lots of the committee worked flat out from dawn till dark – well done all.

However the biggest thanks has to go to all those who attended! With your continued support Picnic in the Park has grown even more professional and fun since our first event in 2014. As you will probably be aware events such as this contribute to the Pattishall Playing Fields Association which works hard to provide such a wonderful local amenity for all to enjoy.

Are you aware: Anyone selling door to door in Northamptonshire must have a peddlars' licence issued in Northampton. A licence issued from another County is not valid. Always let the police know

on 01604 888964 so they can check them out.

Are you aware: NHW has produced a "welcome pack" providing information for new residents. If you would like a welcome pack please contact your Street warden or the Coordinator.

Be aware : Phone/Email/Postal Scams. Do not give your bank details or personal information to anyone who phones/emails (even to someone claiming to be from your bank/Police/NHW). They will never ask for this information.

Smartwater: Is guaranteed for 5 years. Inside the home it should last indefinitely. Items marked and left outside the home will wear off eventually. Check with UV torch. If you need to order more Smartwater the cost is £25. You will need a code to order.

Please remain vigilant and report any suspicious incident/persons/vehicles however trivial straight away on the NHW Police number 01604 888964.

We arrived at a windswept John O'Groats in the afternoon of Wednesday 18th June after a tiring but successful adventure having met some wonderful people en route

and collecting donations from generous supporters.

**Rob Stretton** who completed the entire 950 miles on his bike was joined by others who cycled with him at various stages throughout the 12 days. **Mike Dorrington** cycled most of Scotland from the Falkirk Wheel to the end.

The tractor and trailer performed amazingly - all



credit to **Steve Moore** who restored and drove the tractor all the way. The only problem was a leaky radiator which we had to replace at Kendal.

In Lancashire we met up with Puppy Socialisers and their young pups in training which was a great boost for the team and the supporters. Reports in the media, including the Warrington Guardian helped to generate interest and awareness.

We raised a fantastic **£14,170** from the various fund-raising events, sponsorship and generous donations. This figure will be matched by **The Rugby Group Benevolent Fund** to give a grand total of **£28,340**.

We would like to extend a huge thank you to all of our supporters and sponsors for their very generous support, interest and encouragement before, during and after the trip.

The money raised will make a huge difference to **Dogs for the Disabled** - a charity that creates exceptional partnerships between people and dogs ranging from assistance dogs helping children and adults with physical disabilities and families affected by autism, to pet dog autism workshops and innovative new projects working in schools and residential care settings.

# Cold Higham War Memorial Project

The contract to repair the War Memorial was let by the Parish Council in June. The contractor, Boden & Ward from Flore, took possession of the broken pieces in July and have been repairing them over the summer. They plan to return to site to complete the repair during the week commencing 14<sup>th</sup> September, so with luck by the time of publication this will be done.

On Remembrance Sunday (8<sup>th</sup> Nov) there will be a short service at St Luke's Church and at the memorial itself. This will be followed by a small reception in the Village Hall, at which the results of our research so far into the Memorial and those who are commemorated will be presented to the public. We hope that many members of the Parish will attend. Family members of some of those who fell will be there.

As part of our ongoing research into those who are commemorated, the church records at St Luke's have been explored. The picture below shows a sample of what is there: in this case the register of baptism of Gady Annie Louisa Bottoms in 1899. The national records we have found variously show that she died on 15<sup>th</sup> November 1916 or 1918. She is buried in St Luke's cemetery and has a Commonwealth War Graves Commission headstone (one of two in the churchyard). From this church entry we were able to deduce that she died in 1918, as all the records show her being 20 years old. At some stage, therefore, someone transcribed a 6 instead of an 8! Other entries have helped in other ways.

But we would still like more information please, including about Gady Bottoms. For instance we still don't know how she died, actually four days after the Armistice.

Any photos, anecdotes, memorabilia etc would be most welcome. If you can help at all, please contact us. All the names (twelve from WW1 and two from WW2) are on the web site (see <a href="http://coldhigham.org.uk/war-memorial-2/">http://coldhigham.org.uk/war-memorial-2/</a>). Thank you.

# Poors Allotment Charity Cold Higham/Grimscote

Each year the Trustees of the above charity are able to 'apply the income of the Charity in relieving either generally or individually persons resident in the parish of Cold Higham who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress, by making grants of money or providing or paying for items, services or facilities calculated to reduce the need, hardship or distress of such persons'.

In practice this means that funds may be available for:

- 1. Households with at least one householder being aged 65 or over for heating purposes. Once a grant has been given it will be given annually without the need to make a new application.



## An Improved Bus Service for Eastcote-Astcote-Pattishall

From 1<sup>st</sup> September 2015 our bus service will be run by Country Lion. Although the timings are about the same as before there are some notable improvements:

The first bus after 9.30 am (when bus passes can be used) will now commence at 9.32 am from Eastcote towards Towcester (previously the first bus from Eastcote to Towcester was not until around 11.30 am).

Buses to Northampton will now go via Sainsbury's at Sixfields giving more options for shopping (Boots, M & S, Next, Lidl etc.)

This also gives the possibility of going to the Cinema in the afternoon if the timings are right.

On Saturdays the bus could be used to go to and from the Saints or Cobblers matches.

The bus will also stop near Northampton Train Station before going into the Drapery Bay 19 (outside McDonalds)

Although our buses are not very frequent these changes to the route do give more possibilities. Please try and make use of the service when you can as this will help to ensure it continues, and also, hopefully, in time give us a more frequent service.
